

KS1.CA.T1	Area of study: Line and Shape Unit aims / outcome: To use straight and curved lines to create shapes for their own painting in the style of Paul Klee's Castle and Sun.	
Art and Design concepts to organise knowledge: Drawing: To learn how to use different lines straight and curved to enclose space and create shapes. Painting: To know how to use the primary colours in the style of Paul Klee.		
Key strands of learning:		
Disciplinary knowledge: (line, tone, shape, space etc...) To use straight lines to enclose spaces to create triangles, squares and rectangles and curved lines to enclose spaces to create circles.		
Learning in Reception: Children will have had lots of mark-making experiences with various media (pencils, crayons, pens, chalk, paint), which will have enabled them to work on their gross and fine motor skills to make a range of marks and visual images. Children will know that the primary colours are red, blue and yellow and have used them in their own work.	Tier 2	Tier 3

NC objective:	Vocabulary and crucial knowledge:	
To use a range of materials creatively to design and make products. To use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination. To develop a wide range of art and design techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.	<u>Context of study:</u> Children will learn that an artist is someone who draws or paints pictures or creates sculptures as a job or a hobby. Children will be inspired by Paul Klee, who was best known for his abstract paintings. Children will learn that abstract art does not show things that are recognisable such as people, objects or landscapes. Instead artists like Klee used shapes to achieve effect. Children will learn how to create different types of lines, straight and curved and that dots can be joined to make different lines. Children will recap the primary colours. Children will apply their knowledge of dots and lines to create their own artwork based on Paul Klee's Castle and Sun.	



To learn about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, describing the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, and making links to their own work.

Crucial Knowledge:

To know that Paul Klee was an artist who was best known for his abstract paintings.

To know that abstract art does not show things that are recognisable such as people, objects or landscapes. Instead Klee used shapes to create effect.

To draw straight lines for triangles, rectangles and squares.

To draw curved lines for circles.

To know that dots can be joined to make different types of lines.

To learn how to draw triangles, squares, rectangles by enclosing spaces with straight lines.

To learn how to draw circles by enclosing spaces with curved lines.

To know that the primary colours are red, blue and yellow.
